**THE ADHESIVE STAMPS REGULATIONS 1940,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Adhesive Stamps Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Adhesive Stamps Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 1.

2. These regulations shall be read with and form part of the Adhesive Stamps Regulations 1940* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1947.

4. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the words "Senior Custodian", and substituting the word "Custodian".

5. The principal regulations are amended by revoking Regulation 39 thereof, and substituting the following :—

"39. (1) In this regulation the term 'expiry date' means the 30th day of June in the year 1948 and in every alternate year thereafter.

"(2) All licences granted on or after the 1st day of July, 1947, shall, except as hereinafter provided, continue in force until the next ensuing expiry date.

"(3) Nevertheless, a licence granted within three months before an expiry date may be issued for a period to expire on the second ensuing expiry date after its commencement.

“(4) The Director-General may in his discretion grant a licence expressed to expire at the termination of one two or three months from the day on which it is granted, and any such licence shall, notwithstanding clause (2) of this regulation, expire according to its tenor.

“(5) Every licence shall commence on the day on which it is granted.

“(6) Nothing contained in this regulation shall affect the power of the Director-General to revoke a licence under section 7 of the said Act.”

6. All licences in force at the date of coming into force of these regulations shall, unless previously revoked and notwithstanding the provisions of Regulation 39 of the principal regulations as heretofore in force or as hereinbefore substituted, continue in force until the 30th day of June, 1948, and shall then expire.
