



**THE AGRICULTURAL WORKERS EXTENSION ORDER 1941,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 4th day of
August, 1943

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 20 of the Agricultural Workers Act, 1936, and after submission by the Minister of Labour of the provisions contained in this Order to the organization of the workers of the class affected and the organization of their employers, and after approval of the said provisions in all material particulars by the said organizations, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Agricultural Workers Extension Order 1941, Amendment No. 1.

2. This Order shall be read together with and deemed part of the Agricultural Workers Extension Order 1941* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

3. This Order shall come into force on the 9th day of August, 1943.

4. Clauses 2, 3, and 5 of the Schedule to the principal Order are revoked and the following clauses respectively substituted therefor :—

“ 2. The following rates of pay shall be the minimum rates paid :—

“ For the purpose of this clause ‘light work’ shall be the following :
Pricking out plants, pulling plants, laying out plants, suckering and topping,
passing and tying leaves, and grading and hanking leaves.

“ ‘Field-work’ shall be planting in field, hoeing in field, manuring in field, and picking leaves in field.

“ 3. All time worked in excess of nine hours in any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half. For time worked on Sundays double time shall be paid.

“ 5. All time worked on Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year’s Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, King’s Birthday, Labour Day, and Anzac Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time.”

5. Clause 17 of the Schedule to the principal Order is amended by revoking subclause (a) thereof, and substituting the following subclause :—

“(a) The following rates of pay shall be the minimum rates paid :—

6. The Schedule to the principal Order is further amended by adding the following heading, subheading, and clause :—

“ **GENERAL**

“ *Rates of Remuneration*

“ 29. The rates of remuneration prescribed in this Schedule and applying to the field section or to the shed section shall be increased or reduced in accordance with any general order which may be made by the Court of Arbitration after the 31st August, 1943, to give effect to the provisions of the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942.”
