**THE AGRICULTURAL WORKERS (MARKET GARDENS)
EXTENSION ORDER 1953, AMENDMENT NO. 2**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 15th day of March 1955

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Agricultural Workers Act 1936, and after submission by the Minister of Labour to the organizations of the workers of the class affected and to the organization of their employers of the proposal to vary the Agricultural Workers (Market Gardens) Extension Order 1953* as hereinafter appears, and after approval in all material particulars by the said organizations of the provisions contained in this order, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Agricultural Workers (Market Gardens) Extension Order 1953, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Agricultural Workers (Market Gardens) Extension Order 1953* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 18th day of November 1954.

2. (1) The First and Second Schedules to the principal order are hereby varied in the manner following, that is to say:

(a) Subject to the provisions of this clause, all rates of remuneration prescribed in the said Schedules shall be increased by an amount equal to 13 per cent thereof:

(b) There shall be excluded from the scope of this order such portion of the remuneration in each week of the workers affected by this order as exceeds the amount of £12 in the case of adult male workers, the amount of £9 in the case of adult female workers, and the amount of £7 in the case of junior workers:

- (c) The increase provided for by this order shall apply to the unexcluded portion of the prescribed minimum remuneration of each worker:
 - (d) For the purposes of this order the term "remuneration" means salary or wages; and includes time and piece wages and overtime and bonus and other special payments; and also includes allowances, fees, commission, and every other emolument, whether in one sum or several sums; and also includes travelling expenses:
 - (e) For the purposes of this order the term "junior worker" means a worker of either sex who is under the age of twenty-one years.
- (2) The variations provided for by this order are in substitution for the variations provided for by clause 3 of the Agricultural Workers (Market Gardens) Extension Order 1953, Amendment No. 1, and the said clause 3 is hereby accordingly revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.]

This order brings the wages of agricultural workers employed in market gardens (including market gardens where soft fruit is produced) into line, as from 18 November 1954, with those of workers directly affected by the general wage order made by the Court of Arbitration on 28 October 1954.
