**THE AGRICULTURAL WORKERS LABOUR LEGISLATION
SUSPENSION ORDER 1941.**

WHEREAS it appears to me to be expedient for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, I, Patrick Charles Webb, Minister of Labour, pursuant to the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940,* do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Agricultural Workers Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1941.

2. This Order applies (a) to female agricultural workers of eighteen years of age and over who are employed on dairy-farms or on farms and stations used for the commercial production of wool, meat, and/or grain (including seed) and who have been selected for such employment by an organization authorized in that behalf by the Minister of National Service, and (b) to the employers of such workers.

3. The provisions of Part III of the Agricultural Workers Act, 1936, and of any Extension Order issued thereunder, shall be and are hereby suspended in so far as any such provisions relate to the rates of wages payable to the workers referred to in clause 2 hereof, but such suspension shall be subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth.

4. The minimum rates of wages payable to the workers referred to in clause 2 hereof shall be as follows:—

5. This Order shall come into effect on and from the date of notification hereof in the *Gazette*.
