Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Agricultural Workers Act 1936, and having regard to the prices for the time being fixed under sections 16 and 36 of the Dairy Products Marketing Commission Act 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Agricultural Workers Wages Order (No. 2) 1951.

(2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of August 1951, and shall continue in force until the 31st day of July 1952, and thereafter until a further Order in Council is made in substitution therefor pursuant to section 14 of the Agricultural Workers Act 1936.

2. The Agricultural Workers Wages Order 1951* is hereby revoked.

3. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the following shall be the minimum rates of wages payable under the said section 14 to agricultural workers employed on dairy farms :—

(a) For workers under the age of 17 years	3 8 9
(b) For workers of the age of 17 years but under the age of 18 years	4 5 6
(c) For workers of the age of 18 years but under the age of 19 years	5 3 3

(e) For workers of the age of 20 years but under the age of 21 years	6 16 9
(f) For workers of the age of 21 years and upwards	7 13 0

(2) The above rates shall be deemed to include allowance for work done at week-ends and on holidays as part of the normal week's work.

(3) In the case of those workers who are not provided with board and lodging by their employers the aforesaid rates shall respectively be increased by £1 8s. 9d. a week.

4. The following shall be the minimum rates of wages payable under the said section 14 to casual workers employed on dairy farms :—

Harvesters 3s. 11d. an hour with rations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.]

By this order the rates prescribed in paragraphs (a) to (f) of clause 3 (1) have been increased by 4s., 4s. 9d., 5s. 6d., 6s. 3d., 6s. 9d., and 7s. 6d. respectively for the purpose of increasing the allowance for work done at week-ends and on holidays as part of the normal week's work to the following amounts: Under 17 years, 17s. 9d.; from 17 years to 18 years, £1 0s. 6d.; from 18 years to 19 years, £1 3s. 3d.; from 19 years to 20 years, £1 6s. 6d.; from 20 years to 21 years, £1 8s. 3d.; 21 years and upwards, £1 10s. 6d.
