**THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTRATION (FORMS)
REGULATIONS 1953, AMENDMENT NO. 2**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 28th day of March 1956

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Births and Deaths Registration Act 1951, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Births and Deaths Registration (Forms) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Births and Deaths Registration (Forms) Regulations 1953* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1956.

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 2A (as inserted by the Births and Deaths Registration (Forms) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 1) the following regulation:

“2B. (1) Every certified copy of an entry of death shall be in either form 2 in the First Schedule to the Births and Deaths Registration Act 1951, or in form 11 in the Schedule hereto.

“(2) Every certified copy of an entry of death shall include the particulars set out in the form used for the purpose of the copy.”

3. The principal regulations are hereby further amended by adding to the Schedule the following form:
