



**THE BANKRUPTCY AMENDMENT RULES 1944**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 10th day  
of February, 1944

Present :

RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Bankruptcy Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and with the concurrence of the Right Honourable the Chief Justice and five of the other members of the Rules Committee constituted under the Judicature Amendment Act, 1930 (two of such other members being Judges of the Supreme Court), doth hereby make the following rules under the Bankruptcy Act, 1908.

**RULES**

1. These rules may be cited as the Bankruptcy Amendment Rules 1944.
2. These rules shall take effect on and after the 1st day of March, 1944.
3. The rules made on the 14th day of September, 1931,\* prescribing the commission to be paid to Assignees, are amended by the addition thereto of the following proviso :—

“ Provided that where under the provisions of Part IV of the Administration Act, 1908, an estate is administered by an Official Assignee or Deputy Official Assignee, no commission shall be payable in respect of moneys or any portion of moneys received under any policy of insurance where, by virtue of the provisions of the Life Insurance Act, 1908, such moneys or such portion of moneys are not available for the payment of the debts of the deceased.”
