

# THE BIOSECURITY (TRANSITION AND SAVINGS) REGULATIONS 1996

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 27th day of May 1996

### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to paragraphs (w) and (x) of section 165 of the Biosecurity Act 1993, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Biosecurity (Transition and Savings) Regulations 1996.
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- **2. Interpretation**—In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
  - (a) "The principal Act" means the Biosecurity Act 1993; and
  - (b) Terms defined in subsection (1) of section 2 of the principal Act have the meanings given to them by that subsection.
- 3. Saving of Apiaries Act 1969 for limited administrative purposes—(1) Notwithstanding section 167 (1) of the principal Act, until the close of the 30th day of September 1998 section 46 (a) of the Apiaries

- Act 1969 shall continue to apply to the same extent and in the same manner as if, immediately before the commencement of the principal Act, the Third Schedule to the principal Act had been amended by omitting from the item relating to the Apiaries Act 1969 the words "section 46 (aa) and (ab)", and substituting the words "paragraphs (a), (aa), and (ab) of section 46".
- (2) Notwithstanding section 167 (1) of the principal Act, until the close of the 30th day of September 1998, the Apiaries Act 1969 shall continue in full effect to the extent necessary for the proper administration of section 46 (a).
- (3) Subclauses (1) and (2) of this regulation are in addition to section 171 of the principal Act.
- 4. Transitional continuance of Orders in Council—(1) So far as it is not inconsistent with the principal Act, every Order in Council specified in the Seventh Schedule to the principal Act and not revoked before the commencement of these regulations—
  - (a) Shall be deemed to have been lawfully made by the Governor-General in Council under the principal Act; and
  - (b) Subject to subclauses (2) to (5) of this regulation, shall continue in force until revoked by regulations made under the principal Act (or by Act).
- (2) Every Order in Council (other than the Dog Control and Hydatids Regulations 1985) specified in the Seventh Schedule to the principal Act that—
  - (a) Is not specified in the First or Second Schedule to these regulations; and
- (b) Is still in force at the close of the 30th day of June 1996,—shall then expire and be deemed to have been revoked.
- (3) When a regional pest management strategy comes into effect under the principal Act, every Order in Council specified in the First Schedule to these regulations that is then in force shall cease to apply in relation to any pest to which that strategy applies in that part of New Zealand to which that strategy applies.
- (4) When a national pest management strategy comes into effect under the principal Act, every Order in Council specified in the First Schedule to these regulations that is then in force shall cease to apply in relation to any pest to which that strategy applies.
- (5) Every Order in Council specified in the First or Second Schedule to these regulations that is still in force at the close of the 30th day of September 1998 shall then expire and be deemed to have been revoked.
- (6) Subclauses (1) to (5) of this regulation are in place of section 173 of the principal Act.
- 5. Expiry of sections 179 to 183 of principal Act—(1) Sections 179 to 182 of the principal Act shall expire with the close of the 30th day of September 1998.
- (2) Section 183 of the principal Act shall expire with the close of the 30th day of June 1996.
- (3) Subclauses (1) and (2) of this regulation are in place of section 185 of the principal Act.

**6. Consequential revocations**—Regulations 2 and 3 of the Biosecurity (Transition) Regulations 1995 are hereby consequentially revoked.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force 28 days after notification in the Gazette and expire on 1 October 1998, contain transitional and savings provisions relating to the Biosecurity Act 1993. They provide for—

- section 46 (a) of the Apiaries Act 1969 to continue in force until 30 September 1998
- certain regulations made under enactments repealed by the Biosecurity Act 1993 to continue in force until 30 June 1996
- other such regulations to continue in force until 30 September 1998 (in the case of some of them, unless earlier superseded by a pest management strategy)
- sections 179 to 182 of the Biosecurity Act 1998 to expire on 30 September 1998 section 183 of the Biosecurity Act 1998 to expire on 30 June 1996.
