PURSUANT to section 31 of the Beer Duty Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Beer Duty Refunds (Inter-Governmental Agreements) Order 1978.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1978.

2. Application—This order applies to beer duty for the time being payable under the Beer Duty Act 1977.

3. Refunds—Refunds are hereby authorised of beer duty paid on all beer manufactured in New Zealand in respect of which the Collector is satisfied that it has been delivered solely for the use of any organisation, expedition, body, or person to whom section 31 of the Beer Duty Act 1977 applies.

4. Revocation—The Beer Duty Refunds (Inter-Governmental Agreements) Order 1964* is hereby revoked.

Beer Duty Refunds (Inter-Governmental Agreements) Order 1978

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order replaces the Beer Duty Refunds (Inter-Governmental) Order 1964. The order applies for the benefit of organisations, expeditions, and other bodies approved by the Minister of Customs and established or temporarily based in New Zealand consequent on any agreement between the New Zealand Government on the one hand and any other Government or the United Nations on the other; and of persons temporarily resident in New Zealand as members of any such approved organisation, expedition, or other body.
