



THE BANKING EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1942

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 28th day of January, 1942.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Banking Emergency Regulations 1942.

2. These regulations shall come into force on the 9th day of February, 1942.

3. While these regulations continue in force the Schedule to the Public Holidays Act, 1910 (being a schedule of bank holidays within the meaning of the Banking Act, 1908*), shall be construed as if the references to the following days were omitted therefrom, namely:—

(a) Dominion Day :

(b) The 17th day of March, in celebration of Saint Patrick's Day :

(c) The 23rd day of April, in celebration of Saint George's and Saint David's Day :

(d) The 30th day of November, in celebration of Saint Andrew's Day.

4. (1) While these regulations continue in force the hours during which bank premises are by subsection (2) of section 2 of the Banking Amendment Act, 1921†, required to be open for business on any day shall be deemed to be from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. if the day is not a Saturday, and from 9.30 a.m. to 11 a.m. if the day is a Saturday :

Provided that where the number of the staff employed on any bank premises does not exceed five the premises may be closed between noon and 1 p.m. on any such day that is not a Saturday.

(2) While this regulation continues in force the operation of subsection (5) of section 2 of the Banking Amendment Act, 1921, shall be deemed to be suspended.
