THE BOILERS, LIFTS, AND CRANES EXEMPTION NOTICE 1967

Pursuant to sections 10 and 19 of the Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes Act 1950, the Minister of Marine hereby gives notice as follows.

NOTICE

- 1. This notice may be cited as the Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes Exemption Notice 1967.
- 2. On the recommendation of the Chief Surveyor, the Minister of Marine hereby exempts the boilers and machinery referred to in the Schedule to this notice from the provisions of section 10 of the Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes Act 1950.
- 3. The Minister of Marine hereby exempts the boilers and machinery referred to in the Schedule to this notice from the provisions of section 19 of the Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes Act 1950 relating to periodical inspection.

SCHEDULE

Boilers and Machinery Exempted From Certain Provisions of the Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes Act 1950

- (a) Boilers heated by electricity which do not exceed 2 cu. ft. in capacity and which have a working pressure not exceeding 10 lb to the square inch, which are used to supply instant boiling water for heating food and cleaning, cooking, eating, and drinking utensils in coffee bars, hotel bars, restaurants, cafeterias, canteens, and other similar establishments:
- (b) Model boilers which do not exceed 1 cu. ft. in capacity which are used as toys or by members of Incorporated Model Clubs:
- (c) Boilers which do not exceed 2 cu. ft. in capacity and which have a working pressure not exceeding 15 lb to the square inch which are used for domestic purposes only:
- (d) Boilers which are provided with an adequate open vent and in which the pressure does not exceed 2 lb per square inch:
- (e) Boilers which are used as receivers for gas and do not exceed 2 cu. ft. capacity:
- (f) Boilers which are used as receivers for compressed air and do not exceed 5 cu. ft. in capacity:
- (g) Boilers which are used as air-pressurised water tanks for supplying water to domestic and farm water systems:

SCHEDULE—continued

- (h) Lifts which are used for domestic purposes only in private homes:
- (i) Lifts of the direct acting plunger type in which the underside of the car or platform is directly attached to a ram or plunger and which have a travel of not more than one floor with a maximum of 14 ft and are used for the conveyance of goods or materials only:
- (j) Lifts used to lift motor vehicles for repair, maintenance, or lubrication, the travel of which does not exceed 7 ft:
- (k) Cranes used solely for lifting and towing damaged or brokendown motor vehicles.
