**THE BOILERS, LIFTS, AND CRANES (FEES)
REGULATIONS 1951**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes (Fees) Regulations 1951.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, "the Act" means the Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes Act 1950.

(2) Terms and expressions defined in the Act shall, when used in these regulations, have the meanings so defined.

3. The Inspection of Machinery and Boilers (Fees) Regulations 1948* are hereby revoked.

4. The fees payable to the Secretary in respect of inspections of boilers or machinery under the Act shall be in accordance with the table of fees set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(c) For each steam pressure vessel—			
Not exceeding 50 cubic feet capacity	0	10	0
Exceeding 50 cubic feet capacity	1	0	0
(d) In the case of any premises where miniature boilers not exceeding 1 horsepower or other pressure vessels not exceeding 50 cubic feet capacity are inspected at one and the same time, the fee shall be reduced to half the rate for each such miniature boiler or other pressure vessel not exceeding 50 cubic feet capacity inspected after the first eight.			
(e) The fees prescribed by paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of this clause shall be paid to the Secretary by the maker or importer for the hydraulic test during the first inspection of each boiler, or receiver, or other pressure vessel:			
Provided that the fee for the hydraulic test of any boiler shall not exceed £2.			

2. Lifts :—

(a) For each lift used for the carriage of passengers	1	0	0
(b) For each lift not used for the carriage of passengers	0	15	0
(c) For each service lift with a floor area not exceeding 9 square feet and a goods load not exceeding 5 cwt.	0	5	0

3. Cranes :—

(a) For each crane of a lifting capacity—			
Not exceeding 1 ton	0	9	0
Exceeding 1 ton and not exceeding 2 tons	0	13	6
Exceeding 2 tons and not exceeding 5 tons	0	18	0
Exceeding 5 tons and not exceeding 10 tons	1	7	0

(b) In the case of any premises where more than one crane is inspected at one and the same time and the fees prescribed in respect of the inspections in paragraph (a) of this clause exceed £9 in the aggregate, any fees payable in excess of £9 shall be reduced by half.			
(c) For each steam crane the appropriate boiler inspection fee prescribed in paragraph (a) of clause 1 of this table of fees shall be payable in addition to the fee prescribed for the inspection of the crane.			

4. Winding engines driven by power other than steam :—

(a) For each unit of the aggregate horsepower up to and including 50	0	0	6
For each unit of horsepower over 50	0	0	3
(b) Minimum charge for the inspection of a winding engine driven by power other than steam	1	0	0

5. Where a certificate is granted for a shorter period than the maximum period permitted by the Act, and the Secretary certifies that the certificate was granted for that shorter period in order to meet his convenience, the fee prescribed in any such case shall be reduced by an amount bearing the same proportion to the full amount as the period not covered by the certificate bears to the said maximum period.
