THE BOILERS, LIFTS, AND CRANES (FEES) REGULATIONS 1970

At the Government House at Wellington this 27th day of April 1970

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes (Fees) Regulations 1970.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of June 1970.

2. Interpretation-In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,-

- (a) The expression "the Act" means the Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes Act 1950:
- (b) Terms and expressions used in these regulations and defined in the Act shall have the meanings so defined.

3. Fees for examination of drawings—The fees prescribed in the First Schedule to these regulations shall be payable to the Secretary for examining drawings of boilers, lifts, and cranes, but the fee for examining the drawings of any boiler, lift, or crane which are copies of drawings for which the prescribed fee has been paid shall be one-quarter of the fee prescribed in the First Schedule, but in any case not less than \$2.

4. Inspections of boilers and machinery—(1) For the first inspection of boilers or machinery under the Act fees shall be paid to the Secretary at the rate of twice the amount of the fees prescribed in the Second Schedule to these regulations.

(2) For every inspection of boilers or machinery under the Act other than the first inspection, fees shall be payable to the Secretary in accordance with the fees prescribed in the Second Schedule to these regulations. 5. Revocations—The Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes (Fees) Regulations 1951* and the Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes (Fees for Examination of Drawings) Regulations 1955⁺, are hereby revoked.

5. If a certificate is granted for a shorter period than the maximum period permitted by the Act, and the Secretary certifies that the certificate is granted for that shorter period in order to meet his convenience, the prescribed fee in that case shall be reduced by an amount bearing the same proportion to the full amount as the period not covered by the certificate bears to the maximum period.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations consolidate and amend the provisions of the Boilers, Lifts, and Cranes (Fees) Regulations 1951 and the Boilers, Lifts, and Crates (Fees for Examination of Drawings) Regulations 1955, both of which are now evoked.
