## THE BUTTER LOCAL PRICES ORDER, 1937.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council. Act pursuant to which the regulations were made: The Primary Products Marketing Act, 1936.

Date on which the regulations were made: 3rd day of September, 1937. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 3rd day of September, 1937.

## ORDER.

- 1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Butter Local Prices Order, 1937.
  - (2) In this Order, unless inconsistent with the context,—
    - "Butter" means creamery butter or whey butter manufactured by a manufacturer:
    - "Manufacturer" means the occupier of a manufacturing dairy registered as a creamery or whey butter factory pursuant to the Dairy Produce General Regulations, 1933\*:
    - "Sale by wholesale" includes every sale to any person for purposes of sale by retail, and also includes a sale by a manufacturer to any person who is a supplier of milk or cream to such manufacturer.
- (3) This Order shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.
- 2. (1) The several prices at which butter prepared in one pound pats or smaller portions shall be sold by wholesale for consumption in any part of New Zealand outside the boundary of the Wellington Marketing District, as defined by the Butter (Wellington District) Marketing Regulations, 1937,† shall be the following:—
  - (a) In the case of salted creamery butter the standard of quality of which is not lower than first grade, the price of fourteen pence halfpenny per pound:
  - (b) In the case of salted creamery butter the standard of quality of which is second grade, the price of thirteen pence three farthings per pound:
  - (c) In the case of salted whey butter, the price of thirteen pence halfpenny per pound.

(2) The price for butter sold in bulk by way of sale by wholesale as aforesaid, being butter of the same kind and standard of quality as the kind and standard of quality of butter as is prescribed by subclause (1) hereot, shall be one-eighth of a penny per pound less than the appropriate price prescribed for such last-mentioned butter by the last preceding subclause.

(3) The price for unsalted butter sold whether in bulk or in pats by way of sale by wholesale as aforesaid, being butter of the same kind and standard of quality of butter as is prescribed by subclause (1) hereof, shall be one halfpenny per pound more than the appropriate price prescribed for such last-mentioned butter by the foregoing

provisions of this clause.
