ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 13th day of March 1989

PURSUANT to section 4 of the Bank of New Zealand Act 1988, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title—This order may be cited as the Bank of New Zealand Order 1989.

2. Appointment of date on which Bank of New Zealand deemed to be incorporated as company—The 14th day of March 1989 is hereby appointed as the date on which the Bank of New Zealand shall, by virtue of section 4 of the Bank of New Zealand Act 1988, be deemed to be a company limited by shares incorporated and registered under the Companies Act 1955 and under the name Bank of New Zealand.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

Section 4 of the Bank of New Zealand Act 1988 provides that on a date to be appointed by the Governor-General by Order in Council the Bank of New Zealand, which is constituted as a body corporate under the Bank of New Zealand Act 1979, shall be deemed to be a company limited by shares incorporated and registered under the Companies Act 1955 under the name Bank of New Zealand.

This order appoints 14 March 1989 as the date on which the Bank shall be deemed to be so incorporated. The Bank of New Zealand Act 1979 and the Bank of New Zealand Amendment Act 1986 are, by virtue of section 13 of the Bank of New Zealand Act 1988, repealed on that date.
