ORDER IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 87 (2) of the Biosecurity Act 1993, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Biosecurity (Bay of Plenty Regional Plant Pest Management Strategy) Crown Obligations Order 1999.

(2) This order comes into force on 1 July 1999.

2. Interpretation—In this order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“Bay of Plenty Regional Plant Pest Management Strategy” means the plant pest management strategy approved by the Bay of Plenty Regional Council on 24 September 1998:

“Financial year” has the same meaning as in section 2 (1) of the Public Finance Act 1989:

“General administrative functions” means setting standards, inspection, enforcement, monitoring, surveillance, provision of advice or information, education, direct control (including biological control) of pests, research into biological control, administration, or management.

3. Pest control on land administered by Department of Conservation— (1) The Bay of Plenty Regional Plant Pest Management Strategy applies to the Crown to the extent that the Crown must,—

(a) So far as is practicable, carry out work in accordance with that strategy, to the value of \$128,819 each financial year, on land owned by the Crown and administered by the Department of Conservation under the Conservation Act 1987 or under any Act listed in the First Schedule of the Conservation Act 1987:

(b) Pay the amount of \$22,500 each financial year to the Bay of Plenty Regional Council for general administrative functions as specified in that strategy.

(2) The obligations in subclause (1)(a) are subject to the limitation in clause 4.

4. Additional limitation on work—The Crown’s obligation to carry out the work applies only to the pests specified in the Bay of Plenty Regional Plant Pest Management Strategy.

5. Application of order—This order applies to the financial years commencing on 1 July 1999 and 1 July 2000.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 July 1999, sets out the Crown’s obligations in respect of the Bay of Plenty Regional Plant Pest Management Strategy.
