

THE BOARD OF TRADE (WHEAT AND FLOUR) REGULATIONS 1944, AMENDMENT NO. 3

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 26 of the Board of Trade Act 1919, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, on the recommendation of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Board of Trade (Wheat and Flour) Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Board of Trade (Wheat and Flour) Regulations 1944* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended as follows:

(a) By omitting from the definition of the term "F.a.q. milling wheat" the words "free from all blemish not hereinbefore particularized, and weighing not less than 61 lb. per imperial bushel measure", and substituting the words "and free from all blemish not hereinbefore particularized":

(b) By adding the following as subclause (2) thereof:"(2) In any year the Committee may, in its discretion, prescribe the minimum weight per imperial bushel measure which wheat is required to attain before it is f.a.q. milling wheat within the meaning of these regulations. If no weight is prescribed as aforesaid, the weight of any wheat shall not be taken into consideration when determining if it is f.a.q. milling wheat within the meaning of these regulations".

3. (1) Regulation 66 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 3 of the Board of Trade (Wheat and Flour) Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 2, is hereby further amended by omitting the words "of 1d.", and substituting the words "of $1\frac{1}{4}$ d."

(2) Regulation 67 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 4 of the Board of Trade (Wheat and Flour) Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 2, is hereby further amended by omitting the words "of $\frac{3}{4}$ d.", and substituting the words "of 1d."

(3) Regulations 3 and 4 of the Board of Trade (Wheat and Flour)

Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 2, are hereby revoked.

4. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking

regulation 148, and substituting the following regulation:

"148. (1) No claim shall be entertained in respect of any damage as aforesaid suffered prior to the 1st day of November in any year in respect of a crop planted in that year:

"Provided that the Committee may, in its discretion, permit the lodging of a claim in respect of damage suffered prior to that date.

- "(2) No claim shall be entertained unless, after occurrence of damage to the growing crop due to frost, hail, or flood, the claimant gives written notice thereof to the Committee setting out the date and nature of the occurrence not later than fourteen days after the damage could reasonably be expected to be manifest or, in the case of damage by flood, not later than fourteen days after the subsidence of flood water."
- 5. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 174, and substituting the following regulation:

"174. (1) The Committee shall in respect of every month fix in respect of every mill a quota of flour which may be sold from that mill.

"(2) The Committee shall also in respect of every month fix a quota of flour to be allocated to the Committee and dealt with under regulation 177A of these regulations."

6. Regulation 176 of the principal regulations is hereby amended

as follows:

(a) By inserting, after the words "each monthly quota", the words "in respect of a mill":

(b) By adding the following proviso:

"Provided that nothing in this regulation shall be deemed to affect the right of the Committee to allocate, under the provisions of regulation 177A hereof, the whole or any part of its quota of flour in such manner as it may determine."

7. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after

regulation 177, the following regulation:

"177A. The whole or any part of any quota of flour fixed in accordance with subclause (2) of regulation 174 hereof may from time to time be allocated by the Committee to any miller or millers at such rental and subject to such conditions as the Committee may determine."

8. (1) Regulation 228 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 6 of the Board of Trade (Wheat and Flour) Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 2, is hereby further amended by omitting the words "1s. 2d. on every ton" wherever they appear, and substituting in each case the words "1s. 3d. on every ton".

(2) Regulation 6 of the Board of Trade (Wheat and Flour) Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 1, and regulation 6 of the Board of Trade (Wheat and Flour) Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 2, are hereby

revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations make miscellaneous amendments to the Board of Trade

(Wheat and Flour) Regulations 1944.

Regulation 2 amends the definition of f.a.q. milling wheat. Previously any such wheat was required to be not less than 61 lb. to the bushel measure. In future the Committee will prescribe the appropriate weight in cases where that is considered necessary.

Regulation 3 increases, by \(\frac{1}{4}\)d. a bushel, broker's commission on f.a.q.

milling wheat.

Regulation 4 provides for a time limit within which claims in respect of

damage to crops shall be lodged by growers.

Regulations 5, 6, and 7 provide for a quota of flour to be allocated to the Committee itself. Previously a monthly quota of flour permitted to be sold was allocated to each mill. A quota will be allocated to the Committee and in turn made available to millers as the situation demands.

Regulation 8 raises, by 1d. a ton, the limit of the levy on flour payable to

the Committee.
