## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 19th day of July, 1939.

### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Board of Trade Act, 1919, and of every other power and authority enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby, on the recommendation of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, make the following Board of Trade Regulations.

### REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Board of Trade (Fish Export Price) Regulations 1939.
- 2. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification thereof in the *Gazette*.
  - 3. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
    - "Minister" means the Minister of Industries and Commerce:
    - "Blue cod" means the species of fish Parapercis colias (Forster):
    - "Sale" includes a contract for sale, agreement to sell, offer for sale, and also includes barter or exchange.
- 4. The price at which blue cod intended for export from New Zealand and sold free on board vessels at any New Zealand port may be sold shall be not less than 7½d. per pound.
- 5. These regulations shall remain in force until and including the 31st day of January, 1940, and no longer.
