**BOARD OF TRADE (MEAT GRADING) REGULATIONS 1943,

PURSUANT to the Industries and Commerce Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Board of Trade (Meat Grading) Regulations 1943, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Board of Trade (Meat Grading) Regulations 1943\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Offences**—The principal regulations are hereby amended by adding the following regulation:

“9. Every person who commits an offence against these regulations shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$400.”

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations amend the Board of Trade (Meat Grading) Regulations 1943 to make every person who commits an offence against those regulations liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$400.
