PURSUANT to the Industries and Commerce Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Board of Trade (Wool Packing) Regulations 1948, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Board of Trade (Wool Packing) Regulations 1948* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1971.

2. Maximum weight for bale of wool—Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is hereby amended—

- (a) By omitting from paragraph (a) the expression "400 lb", and substituting the expression "181 kg":
- (b) By omitting from paragraph (b) the expression "450 lb", and substituting the expression "204 kg".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations prescribe the maximum weights for bales of wool in kilograms instead of in pounds.
