

THE BOARD OF TRADE (WOOL PACKING) REGULATIONS 1948, AMENDMENT NO. 4

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 21 (3) of the Industries and Commerce Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Board of Trade (Wool Packing) Regulations 1948, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Board of Trade (Wool Packing) Regulations 1948* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Maximum weight for dense bale of wool—Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following proviso:

"Provided that where wool is packed for sale or transport in a single bale or package other than a woolpack, the maximum weight shall be 318 kg."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations prescribe a maximum weight of 318 kg for a dense bale of wool intended for sale or transport.
