THE BOARD OF TRADE (WOOLPACKS) REGULATIONS 1939.

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 5th day of April, 1939.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to section 26 of the Board of Trade Act, 1919, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby, on the recommendation of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Board of Trade (Woolpacks) Regulations 1939.
- 2. The Board of Trade (Woolpacks) Regulations 1936* are hereby revoked.
- 3. These regulations shall come into force on the day after the notification thereof in the Gazette.†
- 4. The maximum price at which a woolpack may be sold to a purchaser purchasing for his own use and not for purposes of resale for delivery on board boats or on rail or ex store at the following ports—Auckland, Wellington, Lyttelton, Dunedin, Timaru, Bluff, and Oamaru—is hereby fixed at 3s. 10d. for a woolpack measuring 42 in. by 27 in. by 27 in., 4s. 2d. for a woolpack measuring 48 in. by 27 in. by 27 in., and 4s. 6d. for a woolpack measuring 54 in. by 27 in. by 27 in.
- 5. In the case of a sale for delivery at any other point than one of those mentioned in clause 4 hereof the price fixed under the said clause 4 at which a woolpack may be sold to a purchaser purchasing such woolpack for his own use and not for purposes of resale shall be increased by a sum equal to the reasonable cost of transporting such woolpack to the point of delivery from that port amongst the ports of Auckland, Wellington, Lyttelton, Dunedin, Timaru, Bluff, and Oamaru which is nearest or most convenient to the said point of delivery.

6. No person shall sell any woolpack at a price other than the respective prices hereinbefore specified unless he is satisfied on reasonable ground that the purchaser is acquiring the same for purposes of resale and not for his own use.
