

# THE BROADCASTING REGULATIONS 1977, AMENDMENT NO. 3

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 19th day of June 1978

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL
PURSUANT to the Broadcasting Act 1976, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

# REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Broadcasting Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Broadcasting Regulations 1977\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on a date to be appointed for the commencement thereof by the Governor-General by

Order in Council.

2. Conditions of warrants—Regulation 14 of the principal regulations

is hereby amended by adding the following subclauses:

"(3) It shall be a condition of every warrant issued under the Act, whether inserted therein or not and whether the warrant was issued before or after the commencement of this subclause, that the holder of the warrant shall not broadcast any programme that promotes the consumption of liquor, being a programme for which payment is made for that purpose to the holder of the warrant, whether in money or otherwise.

"(4) In subclause (3) of this regulation the term 'liquor' means any spirits, wine, ale, beer, porter, stout, cider, or perry, or any other fermented, distilled, or spirituous liquor, which on analysis is found to contain more than 2 parts percent of proof spirit."

# **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which are to come into force on a date to be fixed by Order in Council, declare it to be a condition of every warrant issued under the Broadcasting Act 1976 that the holder shall not broadcast any programme that promotes the consumption of alcoholic liquor.

The condition relates only to programmes for which payment is made for that purpose to the holder of the warrant.
