



THE BUTTER RATIONING ORDER 1943

PURSUANT to Regulation 8 of the Rationing Emergency Regulations 1942* (hereinafter referred to as the regulations), the Minister of Supply and Munitions hereby makes the following Order.

ORDER

1. This Order may be cited as the Butter Rationing Order 1943.
2. Except as otherwise provided herein, this Order shall come into force on the 28th day of October, 1943.
3. The following goods shall be rationed goods for the purposes of the regulations—namely, butter (meaning the substance usually known as butter manufactured from cow's milk or from any product of cow's milk) and margarine.
4. (1) The retailers of the rationed goods hereinbefore referred to shall be licensed under the regulations.
(2) This clause shall come into force on the 13th day of November, 1943.
5. The consumers of the rationed goods hereinbefore referred to shall be registered under the regulations.
