**THE CHEMISTS' ASSISTANTS LABOUR LEGISLATION
SUSPENSION ORDER 1940.**

WHEREAS it appears to me to be expedient for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, I, Patrick Charles Webb, Minister of Labour, pursuant to the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940,* do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Chemists' Assistants Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1940.

2. This Order shall apply to shop assistants employed in chemist shops and to their employers.

3. The provisions of all Acts and all regulations thereunder and of all awards and industrial agreements under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and of all other voluntary agreements requiring the giving of double time off where an assistant covered by this Order is employed at any time between the hours of seven and nine o'clock in the evening of the statutory closing-day shall be and are hereby suspended subject to the following terms and conditions:—

- (1) Where any assistant is employed in any chemist's shop between the hours of seven and nine o'clock in the evening of the statutory closing-day, such assistant shall within seven days thereafter be paid double time in respect of such period of employment:
- (2) When an employer proposes to employ an assistant between the hours mentioned on the statutory closing-day, he shall give to the Inspector prior notice in writing of his intention so to do.
