THE CUSTOMS AMENDING REGULATIONS 1948, NO. 2

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 22nd day of
December, 1948

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 309 of the Customs Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Customs Amending Regulations 1948, No. 2.
2. These regulations shall be read together with and deemed part of the Customs Regulations made on the 29th day of June, 1914, and published in the *Gazette* on the 2nd day of July, 1914, at page 2675 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1949.
4. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the forms specified in the first column of the table subjoined to this regulation, and inserting in the place of each form so revoked that one or more of the forms set forth in the Schedule hereto as are specified in the second column of the said table opposite the number of the form revoked.

5. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby further amended by revoking forms 17, 32, 58, and 59.

6. Notwithstanding that any form revoked and replaced by a form to the same effect by these regulations differs from the form so substituted, the Comptroller may permit the continuance of the use of the revoked form up to and inclusive of 30th June, 1949, subject to such conditions as he may direct.

7. (1) Regulation 8 of the principal regulations as amended by paragraph (b) of Regulation 19 of the Customs (Tariff Preference and General) Regulations 1936 is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted:—

“8. Except with the permission of the Comptroller, all entries shall be in the size known as foolscap folio, measuring approximately 8½ in. in height and 13½ in. in width.”

(2) Paragraph (b) of Regulation 19 of the Customs (Tariff Preference and General) Regulations 1936 is hereby revoked.

8. Regulation 33 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted:—

“33. Entries for imported goods shall be in the following forms, namely:—

“ (a) For home consumption—in form 14 and form 14A :

“ (b) For warehousing—in form 15 and form 15A :

“ (c) For export or } in form 16.”

“ (d) Removal }

9. Regulation 34 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked.

10. Regulation 47 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted:—

“47. Entries for export of goods not subject to the control of the Customs shall be in form 23 and form 23A and shall be made within six days after the clearance of the exporting ship at the final port of departure from New Zealand.”

11. Regulation 58 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted:—

“58. Entries for clearance of warehoused goods shall be in the following forms, namely:—

“ (a) For home consumption—in form 27, form 27A, and form 27B :

“ (b) For export—in form 28, form 28A, and form 28B :

“ (c) For removal—in form 29 and form 29A or in form 30, as the case requires.”

12. Regulation 66 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted :—

“ 66. The declaration in respect of the invoice for and the value of goods subject to ad valorem duty shall be that declaration prescribed as part of forms 14 and 15.”

13. Regulation 122 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking clause (1) thereof, and substituting the following clause :—

“ (1) Except when required by the Collector, it shall not be necessary for any importer to make entry for postal packets in the following cases :—

“ (a) When the current domestic value of the goods imported by him by any one mail is less than £1 :

“ (b) When the importer is a person not engaged in business and the goods are exempt from the requirement of a licence to import under any law for the time being in force relating to import control :

“ (c) When the duty on the goods is paid by some person outside New Zealand.”

14. Regulation 136 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted :—

“ 136. Entries for goods liable to levy or export duty shall be in form 23 and form 23A.”

15. Regulation 137 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted :—

“ 137. When entry is made of goods liable to export duty, the exporter shall make shipping bill in form 31.”
