THE CUSTOMS AMENDING REGULATIONS 1950

Pursuant to the Customs Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Customs Amending Regulations 1950, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Customs Regulations* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of December, 1950.
- 2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 12 (as substituted by the Customs Amending Regulations 1947†) and substituting the following regulation:

"OVERTIME

"12. (1) The rate of overtime to be paid by the owner or master of any ship, an importer, a brewer, or any other person, firm, or company for the attendance of an officer of Customs occupying any of the following positions, whether temporarily or permanently, shall be as follows :-

attendance of any officer of Customs on a week day. The charge for any attendance for more than one hour shall be made to the nearest quarter of an hour.

- "(3) A minimum charge for two hours shall be made for the attendance of any officer of Customs on a Sunday or a Customs holiday. The charge for any attendance for more than two hours shall be made to the nearest quarter of an hour."
- 3. Regulation 87 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 5 of the Customs Amending Regulations 1947*) is hereby further amended by omitting from paragraph (e) of the proviso the words "a charge of 4s. per hour or portion of an hour", and substituting the words "a charge of 5s. per hour or portion of an hour".
- 4. Regulation 92 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 6 of the Customs Amending Regulations 1947*) is hereby further amended by omitting from paragraph (a) the words "a charge of 4s. per hour or portion of an hour", and substituting the words "a charge of 5s. per hour or portion of an hour".
- 5. Regulation 135 of the principal regulations (as substituted by paragraph (n) of regulation 19 of the Customs (Tariff Preference and General) Regulations 1936[†], and amended by regulation 7 of the Customs Amending Regulations 1947*) is hereby further amended by omitting from subclause (1) the words "a charge of 4s. per hour or portion of an hour", and substituting the words "a charge of 5s. per hour or portion of an hour".
- **6.** The Customs Amending Regulations 1947* are hereby consequentially revoked.

Closing of Hokitika as Port of Entry

- 7. (1) At the commencement of these regulations Hokitika shall cease to be a port of entry for the purposes of the Customs Act, 1913.
- (2) The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby consequentially amended by repealing so much of that Schedule as relates to Hokitika.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations increase from 4s. to 5s. an hour the charge to the public for an officer's time when his attendance is required for the purposes of the Customs Regulations.

Regulation 2 increases the rates of overtime to be paid by the public for the attendance of officers holding the positions specified in the regulation.

Regulation 7 revokes the appointment of Hokitika as a port of entry for the purposes of the Customs Act, 1913.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act, 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 30th day of November, 1950. These regulations are administered in the Customs Department.
