REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Coroners (Fees) Amendment Regulations 1999, and are part of the Coroners (Fees) Regulations 1992* ("the principal regulations").
 - (2) These regulations come into force on 19 November 1999.
- 2. Fees—(1) Regulation 2 (2) (c) of the principal regulations is amended by omitting the expression "3", and substituting the expression "2".

*S.R. 1992/66 Amendment 1997: S.R. 1997/361 (2) Regulation 2 (2) of the principal regulations is amended by revoking

paragraph (d), and substituting the following paragraph:

"(d) For completing an inquest lasting for 2 hours or more, a fee calculated at the rate fifthly specified in the Schedule for every half-hour or part thereof the inquest lasted:".

- 3. New schedule substituted—The principal regulations are amended by revoking the Schedule, and substituting the Schedule set out in the Schedule of this order.
- 4. Revocation—Regulation 4 of the Coroners (Fees) Amendment Regulations 1997 (S.R. 1997/361) is revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 19 November 1999, increase the fees payable to coroners for inquests and related services. The regulations also amend regulation 2 of the Coroners (Fees) Regulations 1992 to allow fees to be calculated on the basis of half-hour periods rather than I hour periods.
