### THE CUSTOMS AMENDING REGULATIONS (NO. 2 1951

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Customs Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Customs Amending Regulations (No. 2) 1951, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Customs Regulations\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1951.
- 2. (1) At the commencement of these regulations Patea shall cease to be a port of entry for the purposes of the Customs Act, 1913.
- (2) The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby consequentially amended by repealing so much of that Schedule as relates to Patea.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations revoke the appointment of Patea as a port of entry for the purposes of the Customs Act, 1913, as from the end of June, 1951.
