THE CARRIAGE BY AIR REGULATIONS 1954

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 8th day of September
1954

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 4 of the Carriage by Air Act 1940, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Carriage by Air Regulations 1954.

2. The provisions of the First Schedule to the Carriage by Air Act 1940 and of subsections four, five, and six of section two of that Act shall extend and apply to carriage by air between New Zealand and the Cook Islands, Western Samoa, the Tokelau Islands, and any other territory for whose international relations the Government of New Zealand is responsible, or between any two of any of the territories referred to in this regulation or between any two territories comprised in the Cook Islands:

Provided that nothing in this regulation shall be construed to apply to any carriage by air in which, according to the contract made between the parties in respect of the carriage, the place of departure and the place of destination are both situated within New Zealand and there is no agreed stopping place outside New Zealand.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations apply the First Schedule to the Carriage by Air Act 1940 (known as the Warsaw Convention) to air transport between New Zealand and certain island territories subject to the control of New Zealand. The Convention already applies to similar services carried on by the National Airways Corporation. The principal effect of the application of the Convention is to limit the liability of the carrier in the same manner as it is already limited in all cases of international carriage by air.
