**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 26th day of March 1979

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. R. D. MULDOON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Copyright Act 1962, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

---

**ORDER**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Copyright (International Conventions) Order 1964, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Copyright (International Conventions) Order 1964\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the 7th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Duty on motor spirits**—Section 187 of the Transport Act 1962 (as amended by revoking the definition of the term “Berne Copyright Union”, and substituting the following definition:

“‘Berne Copyright Union’ means the union constituted by the Berne Convention for the Protection of Literary and Artistic Works signed on the 9th day of September 1886 and completed at Paris on the 4th day of May 1896; revised by the Berlin Convention signed on the 13th day of November 1908 and completed at Berne on the 20th day of March 1914; revised by the Rome Convention concluded on the 2nd day of June 1928; revised by the Brussels Convention concluded on the 26th day of June 1948; revised by the Stockholm Convention concluded on the 14th day of July 1967; and revised by the Paris Convention concluded on the 24th day of July

1971; and 'Country of the Berne Copyright Union' means any country which has adhered to any one or more of the said conventions and is mentioned in Part I of the First Schedule hereto:".

(2) Clause 2 of the principal order is hereby further amended by revoking the definition of the term "Universal Copyright Convention", and substituting the following definition:

"'Universal Copyright Convention' means the convention relating to copyright concluded at Geneva on the 6th day of September 1952 and revised by the Paris Convention concluded on the 24th day of July 1971; and 'party to the Universal Copyright Convention' means any country which has adhered to either said convention and is mentioned in Part II of the First Schedule hereto:".

**3. Countries to which certain provisions of Copyright Act 1962 apply**—The principal order is hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule, and substituting the First Schedule set out in the Schedule to this order.
