



## THE COOPERATIVE COMPANIES ORDER (NO. 2) 1966

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 24th day of August 1966

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Cooperative Companies Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

### ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Cooperative Companies Order (No. 2) 1966.

2. Cooperative wine-making companies are hereby declared to be cooperative companies for the purposes of the Cooperative Companies Act 1956.

3. In this order "cooperative wine-making company" means a company—

- (a) The principal object of which is the making of wine or other potable liquor from grapes supplied to the company by its shareholders, and the marketing of wine or such liquor whether made by the company or supplied to the company by its shareholders; and
- (b) Of the shares issued by which not less than three-fifths in nominal value are held by persons engaged in supplying grapes to the company.
