**THE CUSTOMS DUTIES (IRON AND STEEL) SUSPENSION
ORDER (NO. 2) 1957**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 9th day of October 1957

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Customs Amendment Act 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the existing duties are likely to operate in an injurious manner generally to the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Duties (Iron and Steel) Suspension Order (No. 2) 1957.

(2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October 1957.

2. This order applies to all duties of Customs, including primage duty and surtax, imposed by—

- (a) The existing Tariff (being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1934); or
- (b) Part I or Part II of Schedule XIII to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, as set out in the First Schedule to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948; or
- (c) Any other enactment.

3. All duties relating to the goods set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby suspended until the end of March 1958.

4. Every suspension of duty hereby effected shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act 1913.

5. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.

6. The Customs Duties (Iron and Steel) Suspension Order 1957* is hereby amended by revoking clause 3 and the First Schedule.

SCHEDULE

GOODS ON WHICH DUTIES SUSPENDED UNTIL END OF MARCH 1958

Tariff Item No.	Goods
357	Metal, viz.: Ex (4) Iron, galvanised or <i>plain</i> black, viz: angles, tees and zeds over 4 united inches; channels over 3 in. web; joists and girders 3 in. web and over; beams 6 in. by 6 in. and over; rounds 2 in. and over; squares 3 in. and over; hexagons 3 in. across flats and over.
