THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Customs Amendment Act 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the existing duties are likely to operate in an injurious manner generally to the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Duties Suspension Order (No. 2) 1953.

(2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 20th day of April 1953.

2. This order applies to all duties of Customs, including primage duty and whether imposed by the existing Tariff (being the Second Schedule to the Trade Agreement (Australia) Order 1938*) or any other enactment.

3. All duties relating to the goods set out in the Schedule hereto being the produce of the Commonwealth of Australia are hereby suspended until the end of August 1953.

4. Every suspension of duty hereby effected shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act 1913.
