

THE CUSTOMS DUTIES (EXPEDITIONS TO ANTARCTICA) SUSPENSION ORDER 1956

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Customs Amendment Act 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the existing duties are likely to operate in an injurious manner generally to the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Duties (Expeditions to Antarctica) Suspension Order 1956.
- (2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of August 1956.
- 2. This order applies to all duties of Customs, including surtax and primage duty, and whether imposed by—

(a) The existing Tariff (being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts

Amendment Act 1934, as amended); or

- (b) Schedule XIII to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, as set out in the First Schedule to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, as amended; or
- (c) The Second Schedule to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, as amended; or
- (d) Schedule B to the Trade Agreement between Australia and New Zealand, as set out in the Appendix to the Trade Agreement (New Zealand and Australia) Ratification Act 1933, as amended; or
- (e) Schedule B to the Trade Agreement between Canada and New Zealand, as set out in the Appendix to the Trade Agreement (New Zealand and Canada) Ratification Act 1932, as amended;
- (f) Any other enactment.

- 3. All duties relating to the goods set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby suspended.
- 4. Every suspension of duty hereby effected shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act 1913.
- 5. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.

SCHEDULE

Goods on Which Duties Suspended

ALL imported goods, subject to such conditions as the Comptroller of Customs may at any time impose, in respect of which he is satisfied that they are, at the time of importation or entry for home consumption,—

- (a) Intended solely for the use of such expeditions to Antarctica as may be approved by the Minister of Customs for the purposes of this order; or
- (b) The property of and intended for the use of persons approved by the Comptroller who are temporarily resident in New Zealand solely for the purpose of serving as members of any such approved expedition.
