ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 9th day of August, 1939.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to section 29 of the New Zealand Centennial Act, 1938, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Centennial Exhibition Order 1939 (No. 2).

2. Section 38 of the Licensing Amendment Act, 1910 (dealing with the illegal storing of liquor in a no-license district) shall have no application to the storage or keeping of any liquor within the buildings of the Exhibition referred to in Part II of the said Act in connection with and for the purpose of the exhibition of intoxicating liquors as authorized by subsection (2) of section 29 of the said Act in any stall or place which is open to inspection at any time by any officer of Police.

3. (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 37 of the Licensing Amendment Act, 1910, a Superintendent or Inspector of Police may grant to any exhibitor to whom section 29 (2) as aforesaid applies a permit authorizing him to give free samples of intoxicating liquor in small wine or liqueur glasses for sampling on the stand or stall at which the liquor is exhibited, or to give free samples of such liquor in bottles.

(b) No such permit shall authorize an exhibitor to give any free samples of liquor as aforesaid to any person apparently under the age of twenty-one years.

(c) Any permission to give samples as aforesaid may be revoked if, in the opinion of a Superintendent or Inspector of Police, the conduct of the stall is inimical to public morals or good order, or the exhibitor gives any free samples of intoxicating liquor to any person apparently under the age of twenty-one years.
