THE CUSTOMS EXPORT PROHIBITION ORDER, 1937, NO. 2.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council.

Date of enactment: 29th day of May, 1937.

Date of notification in Gazette: 31st day of May, 1937.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section 47 of the Customs Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and being of opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows :-

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Export Prohibition Order, 1937, No. 2.
- 2. The exportation is prohibited, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose, of white pine or kahikatea timber (Podocarpus dacrydioides).
- 3. This Order in Council shall come into force on the day following notification of the making thereof in the Gazette.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act, 1936.
These regulations are administered by the Customs Department but applications for permits to export white pine timber should be made in the first instance to the Director of Forestry and should be made at least one month prior to the date of intended export of the timber.
