THE CUSTOMS EXPORT PROHIBITION ORDER 1937, NO. 5.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council. Date on which the regulations were made: 20th day of October, 1937. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 21st day of October, 1937.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section 47 of the Customs Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Export Prohibition Order 1937, No. 5.
- 2. The exportation of arms, explosives, and military and naval stores to the New Hebrides is prohibited, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs.
- 3. The Order in Council made under the Customs Laws Consolidation Act, 1882, on the 21st day of January, 1907,* and enuring under the Customs Act, 1913, prohibiting the exportation of arms, explosives, military and naval stores to the New Hebrides is hereby revoked.
- **4.** This Order shall come into force on the day following the date of notification of its issue in the *Gazette*.
