## THE CUSTOMS EXPORT PROHIBITION ORDER 1937, NO. 6.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council. Date on which the regulations were made: 5th day of October, 1937. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 7th day of October, 1937.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section 47 of the Customs Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Export Prohibition Order 1937, No. 6.

2. The exportation is prohibited, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs, of scrap metal of every description, other than scrap precious metal.

3. The Customs Export Prohibition Order 1937, No. 3, made on the 10th day of June, 1937,\* is hereby revoked.

**4.** This Order in Council shall come into force on the day following notification of the making thereof in the *Gazette*.
