THE CUSTOMS EXPORT PROHIBITION ORDER 1939, NO. 3.

GALWAY, Governor-General.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 2nd day of August, 1939.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section 47 of the Customs Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and being of the opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Export Prohibition Order 1939, No. 3.
- 2. The exportation to the United Kingdom of processed milk, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs, is prohibited.
- **3.** For the purpose of this Order "processed milk" means condensed whole milk, condensed skimmed milk, full cream milk powder, skimmed milk powder, butter milk powder, whey powder, or cream.
- 4. This Order in Council shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.
