THE CUSTOMS EXPORT PROHIBITION ORDER 1939, NO. 4.

GALWAY, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 15th day of November, 1939.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section 47 of the Customs Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of the opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Export Prohibition Order 1939, No. 4.
- 2. This Order shall come into force on the eleventh day following notification of the making thereof in the Gazette.*
- 3. The exportation is prohibited (save with the consent of the Minister of Customs) of any sheep to any country, State, or place forming part of His Majesty's dominions or to any other country, State, or place forming part of the American Continent unless each consignment of such sheep is accompanied-
 - (a) By a certificate signed by the Secretary of the appropriate sheep-breeding society or association in respect of the particular breed of sheep intended for export setting forth—

(i) The name and address of the breeder and of the

vendor of the sheep;

(ii) The breed, and whether registered sheep or unregistered sheep, and the number of sheep of that breed included in the consignment in respect of which the certificate is issued:

(iii) The sex and brands or marks of such sheep; and

certifying

(iv) That such sheep were examined and tattooed by an Inspector of the society or association on a date to be stated in the certificate, which shall be within a period of not more than two months prior to the date of shipment of such sheep, and that they were found to be of the standard prescribed by the society or association for registered sheep or unregistered sheep (as the case may be) intended for export; and

(b) By a certificate signed by a Government Veterinarian that the sheep referred to in the foregoing certificate are free from any

infectious or contagious disease.

4. No sheep to which clause (3) of this Order applies shall be laden for export on any ship unless an Inspector of Stock of the Department of Agriculture at the port of shipment has furnished the Collector of Customs or other proper officer at that port with a notice in writing that the certificates hereinbefore referred to have been duly completed.
