THE CUSTOMS EXPORT PROHIBITION ORDER 1939,
NO. 4, AMENDMENT NO. 1

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 2nd day of October 1963

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 47 of the Customs Act 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Customs Export Prohibition Order 1939, No. 4, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Customs Export Prohibition Order 1939, No. 4* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

2. This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

3. Clause 3 of the principal order is hereby amended—

(a) By omitting the words “to any country, State, or place forming part of His Majesty’s dominions or to any other country, State, or place forming part of the American Continent”:

(b) By adding the following proviso:

“Provided that in the case of cross-bred sheep the certificate required by paragraph (a) of this clause shall be signed by an Inspector appointed by the United Breed Societies’ Association.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order—

- (a) Applies the provisions of the Customs Export Prohibition Order 1939, No. 4, to the export of sheep to all countries; and
(b) Provides for certification in respect of cross-bred sheep.
