THE CUSTOM'S EXPORT PROHIBITION ORDER 1946

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 8th day of May, 1946

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 47 of the Customs Act, 1913, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and being of opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Export Prohibition Order 1946.
- 2. This Order shall come into force on the day following notification in the Gazette of the making hereof.
- 3. The exportation is prohibited, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs, of paua (*Haliotis iris*) shell, including the shell in its natural state and partly or wholly processed shell, but not including articles manufactured from such shell.
