THE CUSTOMS EXPORT PROHIBITION ORDER 1947

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 2nd day of April, 1947

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 47 of the Customs Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of opinion that the prohibition hereinafter enacted is necessary in the public interest, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Export Prohibition Order 1947.
- 2. This Order shall come into force on the day following notification in the Gazette of the making hereof.
- 3. The exportation is prohibited, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs, of greenstone (nephrite and precious serpentine) including the stone in its natural state and partly or wholly processed stone, but not including articles manufactured from such stone.
