THE CUSTOMS EXPORT PROHIBITION ORDER 1971

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 15th day of March 1971

THE HON. D. J. RIDDIFORD PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 70 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Export Prohibition Order 1971.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Exportation of certain goods to South Africa prohibited—The exportation to South Africa of the goods specified in the Schedule to this order is hereby prohibited, except with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose.

SCHEDULE

Arms and ammunition.

Vehicles and equipment for the use of the armed forces or paramilitary organisations.

Aircraft and spare parts thereof.
