

THE CUSTOMS EXPORT PROHIBITION (COFFEE) ORDER 1980

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 70 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Export Prohibition (Coffee) Order 1980.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Exportation of coffee—The exportation of the goods specified in the Schedule hereto is hereby prohibited, except with the consent of the Minister of Customs and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose.

SCHEDULE

PROHIBITED EXPORTS

Coffee, being beans and cherries of the coffee tree, whether parchment, green, or roasted, and including ground, decaffeinated, liquid, and soluble coffee:

Provided that this prohibition shall not apply to—

- (a) Coffee for use as ships' stores:
- (b) Coffee exported in quantities not exceeding the following amounts:
 - (i) 60 kg of green coffee; or
 - (ii) 120 kg of dried coffee cherry; or
 - (iii) 75 kg of parchment coffee; or
 - (iv) 50.4 kg of roasted coffee; or
 - (v) 20 kg of soluble or liquid coffee.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. This order provides for the Minister of Customs to control the export of coffee except for coffee—

(a) Used for ships' stores; or
(b) Exported in limited amounts as provided in the Schedule.
