ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 10th day of September 1973

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 70 of the Customs Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

—
ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Export Prohibition Order (No. 3) 1973.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 10th day of September 1973.

2. Exportation of certain animal products prohibited—The exportation of the goods specified in the Schedule to this order is hereby prohibited, except with the consent of the Director-General of Agriculture and Fisheries and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose.

SCHEDULE

Hogget, being meat derived from ovines which are wethers or maiden ewes showing not more than 2 permanent incisor teeth at time of slaughter.

Wether mutton, being meat derived from either a castrated male ovine showing no ram characteristics or a maiden ewe (a female sheep which has not lambed).

Meat meal, meat and bone meal, liver meal, blood and bone, dried blood, bone meal, bone flour, and any mixture of 2 or more of these substances.
