THE CONTRABAND EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1942

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 11th day of February, 1942.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Contraband Emergency Regulations 1942.
- 2. During the continuance of the state of war between His Majesty and the King of Bulgaria, or until further enactment, the articles enumerated in the First Schedule to the Contraband Emergency Regulations 1940* shall be treated as Absolute Contraband and the articles enumerated in the Second Schedule to the last-mentioned regulations shall be treated as Conditional Contraband.
- 3. These regulations shall have the same effect in law as if they were a Proclamation made by His Majesty in exercise of His Majesty's prerogative powers.
- 4. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to limit or abridge the effect of any Proclamation made by His Majesty and extending to New Zealand as part of the law of New Zealand.
