ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 26th day of April 1977

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. R. D. MULDOON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Counties Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the County Enrolment Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 7, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the County Enrolment Regulations 1953* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Claim for enrolment—Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “postal official”, and substituting the word “Postmaster”.

3. Forms—(1) The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking form 2, and substituting the form 2 set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 3 (2) of the County Enrolment Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 6, is hereby revoked.

NOTE—Under section 52 of the Counties Act 1956, every person who wilfully makes a false statement in any claim to have his name entered on any roll of electors commits an offence and is liable to a fine not exceeding \$10.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Regulation 2 is a minor amendment substituting the term "Postmaster" for the term "postal official" as one of the persons who may witness a claim for enrolment.

Regulation 3 substitutes a new form of claim for enrolment as a residential elector in the Schedule to the principal regulations. The changes are consequential on the changes as to qualifications made by the Local Elections and Polls Act 1976.
