**THE CINEMATOGRAPH FILMS AND POSTERS (CENSORSHIP
AND REGISTRATION) REGULATIONS 1956,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 5th day of December 1956

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Cinematograph Films Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Cinematograph Films and Posters (Censorship and Registration) Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with, and deemed part of the Cinematograph Films and Posters (Censorship and Registration) Regulations 1956* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) The Third Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after clause 3, the following clause:

“3A. Fee payable for examination and registration of trailer
(irrespective of gauge) 0 5 0”.

(2) The Third Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby further amended as follows:

(a) By omitting from clause 1 and also from clause 2 the words
“For trailers 0 5 0”:

(b) By inserting in clause 1 and also in clauses 2 and 3, after the word
“film”, the words “(not being a trailer)”.

The effect of these regulations is to provide for payment of only one fee for both the examination and registration of trailers.
